



Leadership Pathways Principal Preparation Program

- Online, ASU Sync, and district specific cohorts
 - Professional Standards for Educational Leaders (PSEL)
 - Online cohort 2 year program ASU Sync & district cohorts are 14 months
- Principled Innovation (PI) is currently woven into 6/12 courses

What does PI look like in the principal internship?

- Leadership Coach: reflective questions and moral dilemmas
- Reflections: moral, civic, intellectual, and performance assets and PI practices & school related videos
- Internship Logs: activity and PSEL and PI practices
- Intern Development Team Meetings: PI on the agenda
- Signature Assignment video: intersection of PI & PSEL


