The skills and knowledge that have been developed to help a family function within a particular culture.

- Practical, life skills assets —cooking, animal care, handiwork, car repair, art, sports and physical activity, unique educational experiences, military service
- Emotional assets —love, closeness, valuing children, types of parenting, resilience, multiple generations available for care, cooperation and/or competition
- Cultural assets —music, language(s), art, dance, literature, experiences with travel, celebrations, deep roots in a particular geographic space, religious or spiritual connections and communities

The talents, strengths, and experiences that children/families from historically marginalized groups bring with them to your classroom and the world

- Aspirational Wealth: Families' hopes and dreams
- Linguistic Wealth: Language and communication skills, including different varieties of English
- Familial Wealth: Wisdom, values, and stories from home communities
- Social Wealth: Relationship-building and relationship-sustaining skills
- Navigational Wealth: Ability to maneuver in unsupportive environments
- o Resistance Wealth: Historical legacy of fighting for justice
