Our Journey Together

Where we began in 2018:


- Imagining a pathway for high school students to deeply explore and be inspired about education as a career to grow our own educators
- 3 courses, 17 students
- Big dreams



Where we are now:

- 100+ high school students enrolled yearly in the P-TEACH dual enrollment pathway with 37 credits where graduates can transition into a registered teacher apprenticeship through CU Denver's NxtGEN program; currently 21 apprentices
- The P-TEACH Professional program with 75 full time para's leveraging dual enrollment courses and a newly created pathway to a BA degree & license using their full-time para position
- Several co-constructed MA degree and added endorsement pathways for practicing teachers to deepen capacity and build teacher leadership





P-TEACH & P-TEACH APPRENTICE

What is P-TEACH?

- A series of courses that offers sophomores, juniors and seniors the opportunity to explore the field of Education.
- Freshman are able to start with Internship.
- P-TEACH students enroll in college courses taught at the district Innovation Center by qualified, outstanding district educators & engage in hands-on classroom field experiences, applying skills through internships and classroom visits
- Significantly reduced tuition through dual/concurrent enrollment
- Students visit Colorado universities to create relationships and participate in various future teacher conferences.

P-TEACH APPRENTICE

- Pathway designed for P-TEACH High School Graduates (RTA)
- Leverages CU Denver's NxtGEN model
- Summer Bridge experience to prepare for college success and necessary skills as an apprentice
- Take courses at CU Denver or can start at local community college and then transfer to CU Denver
- Part-time paid para-educator intern positions freshman-junior year and then as paid residents their senior year
- Braided funding for positions (district general funds, SPED funds, current state funding)
- High touch supports and coaching from district and university faculty/staff
- Robust community of peers



Impact & Outcomes

St. Vrain P-TEACH/P-TEACH Apprentice

- 272 High school students have successfully completed 505 classes and earned 1,515 college credits through P-TEACH
- Currently 21 P-TEACH Apprentices and 2 licensed graduates
- 78% of our P-TEACH graduating seniors indicate that they are planning a career in the field of education
- 51 P-TEACH high school graduates are currently enrolled in Colorado university teacher preparation programs

NxtGEN Program Overall

- Over 150 teachers prepared over the past 10 years across 5 districts
- 55% first-gen, 74% BIPOC, and 52% multilingual







P-TEACH PROFESSIONAL & P-TAP (Para-to-teacher Advancement Pathway)

P-TEACH Professional→**P-TAP**

- Open to all district para-professionals
- Begin by taking the P-TEACH dual enrollment courses at same reduced tuition rate
- Option to continue into CU Denver's new Para-to-Teacher Advancement Pathway (P-TAP)
 - Earn BA and Licensure in Elementary, SPED, or ECE
 - All courses offered after 5 p.m., boundaryless modality
 - University staff collaborate with district/school leaders to leverage their full-time para position throughout the program for clinical experience requirements
 - Opportunities for Credit for Prior Learning
 - P-TAP Fellows have a robust community of support with peers, faculty and staff





Impact & Outcomes

 75 Current St. Vrain Para's engaged in the P-TEACH dual enrollment courses

 5 Currently enrolled in P-TAP to pursue their BA & Teaching License





Co-Constructed MA & Advanced Endorsement Programs



Partnering to Support Advanced Teacher Development

Mentor Teacher Added Endorsement

- Teacher Leadership for Equity
- Online, 9-graduate credit advanced certificate while mentoring a pre-service teacher
- Community of Practice

Co-Constructed MA Programs

- Faculty & District Leaders identify specific courses within the MA program to co-design/co-teach leveraging district expertise and existing professional learning
- Cohort model
- Examples: Literacy, Principal Prep
